



Interstate Medical Licensure Compact

For Immediate Release – Update of Interstate Medical Licensure Compact Commission (ILMCC) progress.

- On December 31, 2018, Governor Rick Snyder signed into law House Bills 4066 and 4067. This action makes Michigan the 27th Member State/Territory/District to join the commission.
- On January 30, 2019, the Tennessee Board of Osteopathic Examination and the Tennessee Board of Medical Examiners become active participants in the IMLCC and are now able to act as a State of Principal License (SPL) and issue licenses.
- So far, the 2019 legislative sessions have seen 6 states introduce bills to join the IMLCC. Those states are Georgia, Kentucky, North Dakota, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and South Carolina.
- The IMLCC staff are actively working with the Territory of Guam, District of Columbia, and the State of Pennsylvania boards so that they can become active participants.
- The States of Maryland and Michigan have legislation which delayed implementation to July 2019; however, work with the respective boards to become active participants is on-going.
- The State of Vermont's legislation delayed implementation to January 2020. The work will start in late summer to ensure that the board becomes an active participant on the implementation date.
- Between April 2017 and December 2018; the IMLCC processed 2,399 applications which resulted in 4,511 licenses being issued.
